

Quiver construction.....

Materials:

Scissors

Cardboard (about toilet paper roll thickness, that is, actually, the very best thing to use, it's already curved! LOL)

Leather/wool/felt/whatever

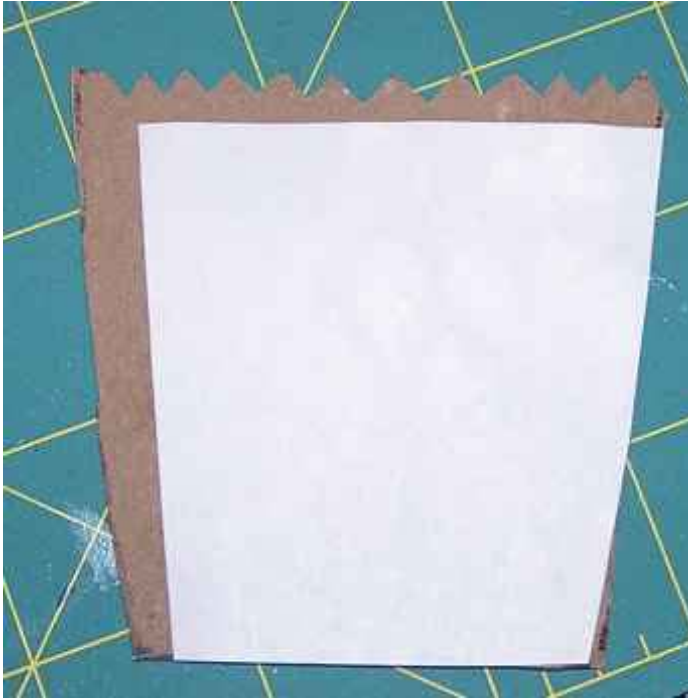
Contact cement and/or Aileen's

Here's the pattern..... (well, ok, a scan of the pieces I actually used....)



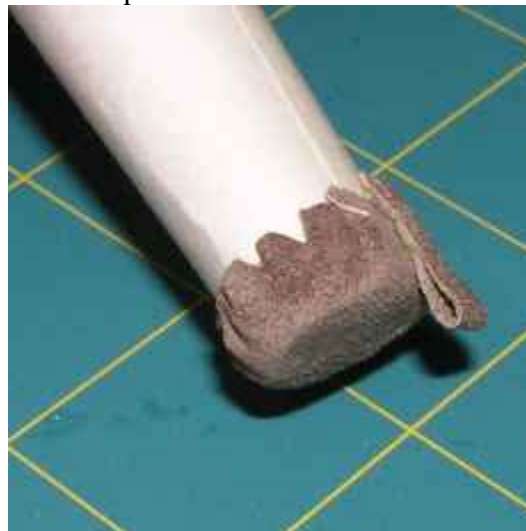
This one's a little wider at top than bottom – you **can** just cut out a random rectangle, that works fine too.....

The 'cover' is cut $\frac{1}{4}$ " wider and a $\frac{1}{4}$ " taller than the cardboard – for the base, tape up your cardboard along the seam, put it on your material, trace around it, give yourself $\frac{1}{4}$ " seam allowance..... like so (in case you don't want to use the pattern)

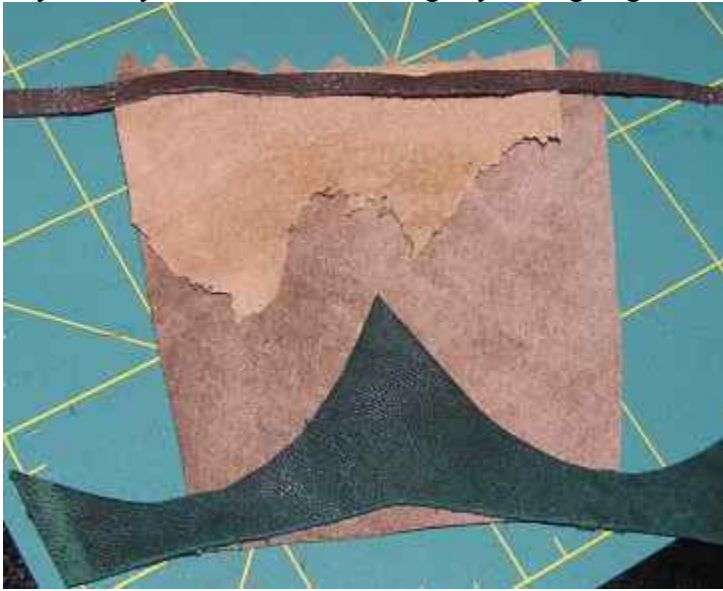


Alrighty – the top edge of the quiver cover and all around the bottom need to have those silly triangles cut out. Once you’ve done that – run a line of glue along the seam allowance of the bottom bit, put it on the quiver and push the edges down so it sticks! LOL

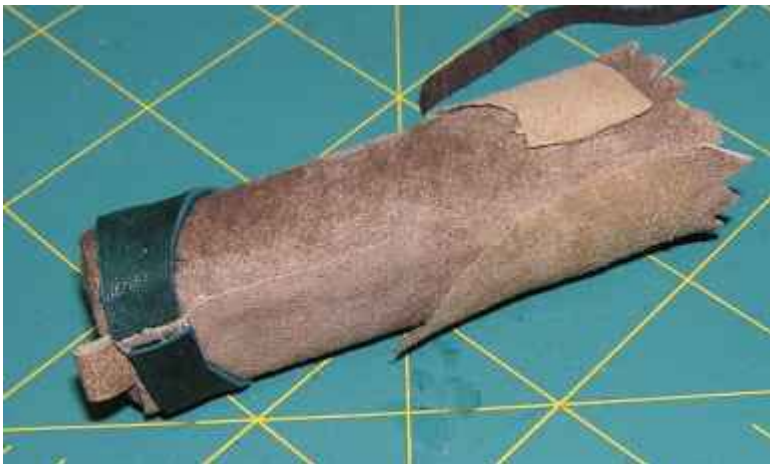
Next... You want to attach the belt (or belt loop, I’m using a loop because I haven’t decided what I’m going to do for her belts yet.) to the bottom of the quiver.



Lay out any embellishments/designs you're going to use and sew/glue/attach them to the quiver cover.



Glue the quiver cover to the quiver – a line along one side first (and attach) – then a line along the bottom and finally a line along the loose end.



Alrighty – we're cooking with gas now! – A line of glue along the inner edge of the top and tuck it into the quiver, attach either the top end of the belt and/or a belt loop and.....



POOF! – a Quiver! grin
